Letter from the Executive Director



What a huge year!

I'm excited to share this annual report with you as 2023 proved to be a big year for the Village of Merici.

One of the biggest highlights of the year saw the completion of our second location, a beautiful integrated housing community in Carmel, Indiana. We are honored to have partnered with Old Town Companies with this project and pleased to manage 40 attainable apartments designated for adults with intellectual or developmental disabilities within this new community. We are grateful to

the members of the Old Town team for their vision of an integrated model and commitment to provide attainable housing on Indy's north side.

Shortly before the pandemic several years ago, we had established the Merici Kitchen Project, a commercial kitchen located at Merici Village Apartments with the intent of establishing a variety of cooking classes and pre-employment training. We were able to utilize the kitchen during the pandemic on an individual basis with one-on-one personal skills development. In July, we hired a kitchen manager and restarted the project with a series of group cooking classes that filled immediately. We look forward to continued utilization of this space as we develop many new opportunities in the coming year.

After a year, The Cincy Hat Project continues to create new awareness for our mission. We are thrilled that Ted Karras was nominated by the Cincinnati Bengals for the Walter Payton Man of the Year Award through his direct involvement with the individuals we support. We appreciate his time and dedication to our organization.

Based on the number of wonderful projects already in the works, we anticipate another big year ahead. Thank you for your continued support in our efforts as we strive to support more adults with disabilities. We couldn't do it without you.

Merici Kitchen Project is Back in Action

It has taken a while, but the Merici Kitchen Project is now in full swing. The commercial kitchen located within Merici Village Apartments, has been in the works for quite a while. What once began with funding acquisition in 2017-18 through several grantors, construction completion in 2019, and was just getting off the ground when the pandemic began, limiting training to one-on-one sessions.

The kitchen saw very limited use until mid-2023 after all pandemic restrictions were lifted, and a kitchen manager was hired. Since that time, the kitchen has flourished with more than 30 different participants attending classes during the last half of the year. Classes have been focused on basic skills building, preparation and cooking, nutrition, and at-home meal preparation with goals toward personal independence.

During the month of November, awareness and gratitude of others was incorporated when kitchen classes created a variety of baked goods and delivered them to community service organizations within the Lawrence area.

As the Merici Kitchen Project continues to develop, plans are underway to expand class options, incorporate produce and herbs from the courtyard garden, and work to increase individual knowledge and skills.











Second Location is Now Open in Carmel

Offering 40 attainable apartments to those with disabilities.

It's officially open! The North End Project in Carmel, a partnership between Village of Merici, Old Town Companies, and Rdoor Housing Corporation, has celebrated the grand opening. The multi-year project began with a Moving Forward 2020 Grant awarded through the Indiana Housing & Community Development Authority (IHCDA). This master development includes single-family residences, townhomes, apartments, offices, and retail space.

North End Apartments, offers 168 units with 40 apartments designated at an attainable rate for adults with intellectual or developmental disabilities. With affordable housing at a crisis level throughout the state of Indiana, the 40 units were in high demand. As hundreds of applicants applied for the 40 apartments, a lottery was held to determine the final occupants. This magnificent community is the largest attainable housing initiative created in Carmel.

The Village of Merici is honored to have partnered with Old Town Companies and Rdoor in this project and appreciate their understanding and commitment to making beautiful, attainable housing a reality for those with disabilities.



In Memory of Erica Marie Herran

October 10, 1982 - October 7, 2023



Erica Marie Herran, 40 of Indianapolis, was such a sweet, loving, and amazing woman. She is still intensely missed by so many and not a day goes by that I, her Team Leader at the Village of Merici and Life Skills Coach of three years, do not think of her, as I know so many others feel the same way. Erica was the strongest woman I know. She overcame so many obstacles, both medically and emotionally, from such a young age. She persevered through many adversities throughout her life and always did so with a positive mindset, a smile, and her oh so hearty laugh. I remember we would always joke about how she had 9 lives and how I needed to know her secret. Erica was such a thoughtful person. She always gave to others very personalized gifts or verbal praise. She had a passion for food crafting, like decorating or making cookies, desserts, and candies. I remember when I supported Erica during my first pregnancy and struggled with a challenging birth and low milk supply. This woman went out of her way to look up and research foods that would help boost my supply, and then made up three different batches of protein power balls to give me to help. I still make those things

today. Erica was such a good listener and genuinely cared about others. She had a memory of a dolphin too, never forgetting a detail, and was quick witted. She always made it a point to catch up on how my children were doing, asking about milestones and funny chaos that ensued. We often spent our time talking and laughing about those crazy stories and moments of her dog Max and his shenanigans. I miss that. He is a Boston Terrier and Shih Tzu mix, and she loved and pampered him. Max was Erica's best friend and always by her side, even up until her last days.

Erica was an athlete in the National and World Transplant Games, as well as in Special Olympics. Her sports included Basketball, Bocce, Bowling, Cornhole, Golf, Swimming, and Track and Field. Swimming was her favorite event, beginning when she was just six years of age and continuing through 2022. She was also a member of Crossroads of America Scout Band. Even in her last year of life, when her medical emergencies and restrictions prevented her from participating in some sports, she still made it a point to show up to practice to engage with her teammates and show her support. Erica was recognized by her efforts, sportsmanship, and winnings with medals and ribbon awards and confidently displayed them all around her office, bedrooms, and home neatly in display cases. One of Erica's hobbies was organizing and we, like many others, often joked about how she kept the Container Store in business.

Erica Marie Herran was such a sweet and loving woman. Her mother, like many, is so proud of all her accomplishments and the love she showed and poured out to others. Erica is so incredibly missed but is finally at peace. She is survived by her parents and her brother, Andrew Herran. She was proceeded in death by her brother, Nicholas Herran, earlier this year. Again, despite all that Erica endured and lived with and through, she always made it a point to never focus on the negative, but instead, the positive. She was incredible. We love and miss you, Erica.

Merici attendees were treated like royalty throughout the day enjoying a suite, participation in the mid-field half-time presentation, an incredible win for the Bengals in overtime, and postgame celebration on the field with Ted Karras and quarterback Jake Browning. It was an unforgettable day.

We've Gone Retail

The Cincy Hat merchandise continues to grow with hats being sold in ten current retail locations throughout the Cincinnati area.

Winning the Fan Vote and \$35,000

Although the final candidate for the prestigious Walter Payton Man of the Year Award is determined by the NFL, Nationwide sponsors a "Fan Favorite" Charity Challenge portion where football fans can literally vote for their favorite nominee. Why Can't Someone with a Disability Own Their Own Home?

The wait is almost over! A second Lawrence location will open in the fall. We are thrilled to present a new concept in affordable housing. The Brunette, offering 32 beautiful condominium units, challenges the norm for housing opportunities for adults with disabilities by offering the possibility of home ownership.

Most adults with disabilities live at the lowest socio-economic level and receive subsidy through two possible Indiana housing choice vouchers. To be eligible to receive state subsidy, all combined income for an adult with disabilities, must remain under \$2,000 per month. Not only does this system perpetuate the cycle of poverty, but it does not provide much possibility for ever being able to attain permanent long-term housing.

There are local lending institutions that do offer significant loan opportunities for someone with a disability to own their own home. Home ownership is an asset that does not affect Medicaid benefits. This allows The Brunette to offer the opportunity for an adult with disabilities to own their own home, a concept that the Village of Merici is honored to offer.
